IV. Answer in detail:

1. Write about a wheel chair and a ramp.

Wheel chair:

- A wheel chair is a chair with wheels.
- Wheel chairs are used by people for whom walking is difficult or impossible due to illness, injury or disability.
- The wheels of the chair can either be operated by the person occupying the chair or by the electric motors.
- There are often handles behind the seat to allow it to be pushed by another person.



Ramp:

- An inclined surface or roadway connecting different levels.
- It is very much useful for the wheel chair user and the care taker at risk for injury.
